19 **PARTIES**

20 1. Lisa M. Moore (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official
21 capacity as the Bureau Chief of the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau, Department of Consumer
22 Affairs.

23 2. On April 7, 1997, the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau issued Funeral Director
24 License Number FDR 583 to Lawrence Alva Dyer (Respondent). The Funeral Director License
25 expired on April 30, 2013, and has not been renewed.

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JURISDICTION

3. This Accusation is brought before the Director of Consumer Affairs (Director) for the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau (Bureau), under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.

4. Section 118, subdivision (b) of the Code provides that the suspension, expiration, surrender, or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Bureau of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued or reinstated. Under section 7725.5 of the Code, the Bureau can renew a license within five years of its expiration.

5. Section 7686 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Bureau may suspend or revoke a license, after proper notice and hearing to the licensee, if the licensee has been found guilty by the Bureau of any of the acts or omissions constituting grounds for disciplinary action.

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

6. Section 477 of the Code states:

As used in this division:

(a) "Board" includes "bureau," "commission," "committee," "department," "division," "examining committee," "program," and "agency."

(b) "License" includes certificate, registration or other means to engage in a business or profession regulated by this code.

7. Section 482 of the Code states:

Each board under the provisions of this code shall develop criteria to evaluate the rehabilitation of a person when:

(a) Considering the denial of a license by the board under Section 480; or

(b) Considering suspension or revocation of a license under Section 490.

Each board shall take into account all competent evidence of rehabilitation furnished by the applicant or licensee.

8. Section 490 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that a board may suspend or revoke a license on the ground that the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the business or profession for which the license was issued.

9. Section 493 of the Code states:

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in a proceeding conducted by a board within the department pursuant to law to deny an application for a license or to suspend or revoke a license or otherwise take disciplinary action against a person who holds a license, upon the ground that the applicant or the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of the licensee in question, the record of conviction of the crime shall be conclusive evidence of the fact that the conviction occurred, but only of that fact, and the board may inquire into the circumstances surrounding the commission of the crime in order to fix the degree of discipline or to determine if the conviction is substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of the licensee in question.

As used in this section, "license" includes "certificate," "permit," "authority," and "registration."

10. Section 7691 of the Code states:

Conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions and duties of the license holder in question constitutes a ground for disciplinary action. The record of conviction, or a certified copy thereof, shall be conclusive evidence of such conviction.

11. Section 7709 of the Code states:

A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this article. The bureau may order the license suspended or revoked, or may decline to issue a license, when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under the provisions of Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing such person to withdraw his plea of guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or dismissing the accusation, information or indictment.

REGULATORY PROVISIONS

12. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1252 states:

For the purposes of denial, suspension, or revocation of a license pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a crime or act shall be considered to be substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensed funeral establishment, licensed funeral director, or licensed embalmer if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a licensed funeral establishment, licensed funeral director, or licensed embalmer to perform the functions authorized by his license in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare. Such crimes or acts shall include but not be limited to those involving the following:

1 (a) Conviction of a crime involving fiscal dishonesty.

2 (b) Any violation of the provisions of Chapter 12, Division 3 of the
3 Business and Professions Code.

4 13. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1253.5 states:

5 (a) When considering the suspension or revocation of a license on the
6 ground that a licensed funeral establishment, licensed funeral director, or licensed
7 embalmer has been convicted of a crime, the Board, in evaluating the
8 rehabilitation of such person and his eligibility for a license, will consider the
9 following criteria:

8 (1) Nature and severity of the act(s) or offense(s).

9 (2) Total criminal record.

10 (3) The time that has elapsed since commission of the act(s) or offense(s).

11 (4) Whether the licensee has complied with any terms of parole, probation,
12 restitution or any other sanctions lawfully imposed against the licensee.

13 (5) If applicable, evidence of expungement proceedings pursuant to
14 Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code.

15 (6) Evidence, if any, of rehabilitation submitted by the licensee.

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17 COSTS

18 14. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Bureau may request
19 the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or
20 violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation
21 and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not
22 being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs
23 may be included in a stipulated settlement.

24 CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

25 (Jun. 23, 2011 Convictions for Stalking and Threats Between Dec. 31, 2010 and Mar. 28, 2011)

26 15. Respondent has subjected his license to disciplinary action under Code sections
27 490 and 7691 in that he was convicted of crimes that are substantially related to the
28 qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensed funeral director. The circumstances are as
follows:

a. On June 23, 2011, in a criminal proceeding entitled *The People of the State of California vs. Lawrence A. Dyer*, in San Diego County Superior Court, Central Division, Central Courthouse, Case Number SCD233239, Respondent was convicted on his plea of guilty for violation of Penal Code (PC) sections 646.9, subdivision (a), stalking, and 422, criminal threats, felonies.

b. As a result of the convictions, on June 27, 2011, Respondent was sentenced, to a prison term of two years and eight months, which was suspended, and granted probation subject to terms and conditions. On May 17, 2013, Respondent admitted to violating the terms of his probation in that he used controlled substances. As a result of the violation, Respondent's probation was revoked. Respondent's sentence of two years and eight months was imposed without bail, with credit for 386 days actually served. Respondent was also ordered to pay a fine of \$400.00.

c. The circumstances that led to the convictions are that on and between December 31, 2010, and March 31, 2011, Respondent repeatedly followed and harassed a woman. The woman continuously feared for her safety. On March 31, 2011, Respondent threatened a man with great bodily injury. Respondent's unequivocal, unconditional, and immediate threat caused the man fear for his safety.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Director of Consumer Affairs issue a decision:

1. Revoking or suspending Funeral Director License Number FDR 583, issued to Lawrence Alva Dyer;

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1 2. Ordering Lawrence Alva Dyer to pay the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau the
2 reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and
3 Professions Code section 125.3;

4 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
